## **INSTRUCTIONS**

Only medical practitioners that can legally prescribe under Washington state law can use this exemption certificate. For information regarding exemptions, contact Washington State Department of Revenue Taxpayer Information Center at (360) 705-6705 or 1-800-647-7706 or visit the Department's web site at: <u>dor.wa.gov</u>.

<u>Line 1</u> applies to drugs for human use and over-thecounter drugs prescribed for human use.

<u>Line 2</u> applies to disposable devices used to deliver drugs for human use, pursuant to a prescription.

<u>Line 3</u> applies to purchases by licensed health care professionals of dietary supplements for human use dispensed or to be dispensed to patients, pursuant to a prescription.

<u>Line 4</u> applies to medicines of mineral, animal and botanical origin prescribed, administered, dispensed, or used in the treatment of an individual by a Naturopath licensed under chapter 18.36A.

<u>Line 5</u> applies to drugs and devices used for family planning purposes, including prevention of conception, dispensed to patients pursuant to a prescription or supplied by a family planning clinic that is under the contract with the Department of Health

<u>Line 6</u> applies to medically prescribed oxygen, including, but not limited to, oxygen concentrator systems, oxygen enricher systems, liquid oxygen systems, and gaseous, bottled oxygen systems prescribed for an individual by a Osteopathic Physician or Physician licensed under RCW chapter 18.57 and 18.71.

Line 7 applies to insulin for human use.

<u>Line 8</u> applies to purchases by licensed health care professionals of prosthetic devices which are prescribed, fitted or furnished. Prosthetic device (including repair and replacement parts) are replacement, corrective and supportive devices worn on or in the body to: artificially replace a missing portion of the body; prevent or correct a physical deformity or malfunction; or support a weak or deformed portion of the body.

<u>Line 9</u> applies to frames lenses, and optical merchandise purchased by optometrists, ophthalmologists, and opticians.

<u>Line 10</u> applies to purchases by dentists and other health care providers of dental prostheses, if the dental prostheses meet the definition of "prosthetic device."

<u>Line 11</u> applies to ostomic items used by colostomy, ileostomy, or urostomy patients, including but not limited to bags, belts to hold up bags, tapes, tubes, adhesives, deodorants, soaps, jellies, creams, germicides, and other like supplies.

<u>Line 12</u> applies to kidney dialysis devices, including repair and replacement parts, prescribed for human use.

<u>Line 13</u> applies to human blood, tissue, organs, bodies, or body parts for medical research and quality control testing purposes.

<u>Line 14</u> applies to certain medical supplies, chemicals, or materials by comprehensive cancer centers, organ procurement organizations, and qualifying blood and tissue banks.

<u>Line 15</u> applies to free hospitals for items reasonably necessary for the operation of, and provision of health care by, free hospitals "Free hospital" means a hospital that does not charge patients for health care provided by the hospital.

<u>Line 16</u> applies to purchases by a licensed practitioner of laboratory reagents and other diagnostic substances used to diagnose, cure, mitigate, treat or prevent disease in humans. The laboratory reagents and diagnostic substances must be prescribed to an individual and interact with a specific patient's specimen.
